IBIS CHARITIES FOUNDATION MISSION

Established in 2012 by the Board of Directors of The Club at Ibis, Ibis Charities Foundation is a 501(c)(3) charity dedicated to granting financial support to non-profit organizations providing family and social services, medical care and food, and cultural and environmental awareness activities for the residents of Palm Beach County.



RAISED OVER \$525,000 IN 2024-25

Thanks to the generous support of our 135 Major Sponsors as well as Corporate and In-Kind Donors, and over 1,000 event participants Ibis Charities Foundation raised \$526,000 and awarded grants to 41 organizations.

Ibis Charities Foundation grant awards target these areas: Health and Wellness, Education, Family and Social Services, and Cultural and Environmental Awareness. Since its founding, Ibis Charities has committed over \$4 million dollars to worthy organizations.



HOW GRANTS ARE AWARDED

Ibis Charities Foundation's grant acceptance period opened Sept. 15, 2024, and closed Oct. 15, 2024. Application information is found on the Ibis Charities Foundation website. Prospective grant recipients complete and submit the application using the grants portal found on our website, ibischaritiesfoundation.org. The application also includes financial and tax return information. Ibis Charities Foundation (EIN: 46-0639640) only funds 501(c)(3) organizations that will improve the lives of Palm Beach County residents.

As grant applications are received, an initial vetting is completed by a subset of the grants committee and a financial review occurs if the application is to be considered further. Once an application passes both steps, the full grants committee reviews and determines whether it should move to an in-person site or virtual visit via Zoom. A final review is then completed by the full grants committee before a recommendation is made to the Ibis Charities Foundation Board of Directors.

For the 2025-2026 giving year, our grant application period was Sept. 1-30, 2025.

Training/coaching with teens to develop them into leaders/mentors who are then employed to mentor local first to eighth graders - primarily in Belle Glade.

In collaboration with another charity to provide specialized training so participants can work in the food service industry.

Path to College

Support and resources for children from low-income environments to help prepare them to attend college.

Pediatric Oncology Support Team

Support for the creation of social outings for families that are dealing with cancer treatment for a loved one.

Project LIFT

Provides a 14-week program for at risk teens and young adults with mental health treatment, vocational training, and life skills development.

Roots and Wings Inc.

Intensive after school reading tutorial program for students reading below grade level.

Student ACES

After school program in Belle Glade, for those living in disadvantaged conditions, designed to improve their health, mental wellness, career readiness, college prep, and character development.

Suits for Seniors

Provides an 8-week curriculum, twice per year, to cover leadership skills, goal setting, financial literacy, and career exploration.

Sweet Dream Makers Inc.

Providing beds to vulnerable families without resources to replace unsanitary furniture.

The Arc of Palm Beach County

Personalized care for adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities in a household setting.

The Busch Wildlife Sanctuary Inc.

Provides wildlife rescue and rehabilitation along with education about environmental conservation.

The Glades Initiative, Inc.

Assists Belle Glade residents to access Medicaid and other benefits, as well as provides a large food pantry for those in need.

Officers provide mentorship to those youth that are at risk to falling into a life of crime.

HEALTHY MOTHERS, HEALTHY BABIES: Ensuring Moms and Babies Have the Best Start Possible



The Healthy Mothers, Healthy Babies Coalition of Palm Beach County offers various programs to support pregnant women and new mothers. The Ibis Charities Foundation is proud to support one of their key initiatives, Basics4Babies Emergency Pantry for Infants, which provides essential supplies like diapers, baby food, and formula to

families in need with children up to three years old. This program has been running since 1986, expanding over the years to meet growing community needs, and in 2021, they introduced a mobile distribution service to reach neighborhoods with the greatest need.

IBIS CHARITIES FOUNDATION: GRANTS AT WORK

PROJECT UPLIFT: Making a Significant Impact on Children's Lives

During the 2024–25 school year, Roots and Wings' Project UpLift supported 15 Title I elementary schools in Palm Beach County, where only 57% of third-grade students currently read at grade level. Every student in the program started one to two grade levels behind and was in the bottom 25% of their class. Through consistent tutoring and encouragement, 96% of the third graders taking part in the program made significant reading gains and achieved promotion rates comparable to their classmates, even though they started much further behind. These results illustrate the program's effectiveness in closing the reading gap and fostering student growth during this critical educational stage.

A special plaque was installed outside a third-grade classroom at the Dwight D. Eisenhower Elementary School in Palm Beach Gardens to honor Ibis Charities Foundation for its grant supporting the Roots and Wings' Project Uplift student tutorial program. Third grade teachers, who are also literacy tutors in this after school initiative, praised the program for improving their student's reading skills and confidence and expressed their gratitude for the Foundation's support that enables their tutoring work.

IBIS CHARITIES FOUNDATION: GRANTS AT WORK

PROJECT LIFT: Changing Young Lives through Innovation



Project Lift, a recipient of one of this year's grants, is dedicated to improving the lives of young people aged 14 to 24 by providing free mental health counseling, mentoring, and vocational skills training. Participants receive hands-on vocational training in various trades while licensed therapists address mental health issues such as depression, anxiety, addiction,

trauma, abuse, and anger management. Additionally, participants who have dropped out of school, can earn an accredited high school diploma on-site with individualized teacher assistance and access to after school programs. Thus far in 2025, over 700 participants have been served through this innovative program.

COLLEGE FOR KIDS: Opening Doors to Higher Education



College for Kids, Inc. is committed to providing mentorship resources and experiences that empower scholarship recipients from low-income families to successfully pursue higher education. As part of their program to expand these children's horizons and help students visualize their future, they were provided with a transformative experience to

visit college campuses across Florida this fall. In just 24 hours, over 120 students embarked on a journey to visit nine colleges and universities in three regions, including North Florida, Jacksonville, and Central and South Florida. Students were able to tour the campuses, interact with admissions staff and campus representatives and gain insight into academic programs and campus life. The Ibis Charities Foundation grant supports this organization's efforts to help students begin to make informed choices about their future, by providing mentorship resources and experiences that empower scholarship recipients to pursue a higher education with confidence.




